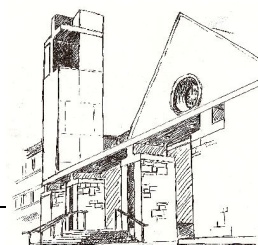



Per Capita: Please consider paying your \$28 annual Per Capita fee for being a member of West Side congregation in the Presbyterian Church USA. It is a requirement for being part of the PCUSA. This fee supports the ministry of our presbytery, synod and General Assembly. We pay the fee on every active member. West Side currently has about 1485 active members. At \$28 x 1485, this year West Side will pay an annual fee of about \$41,600 to the greater church. We must pay this fee for every member, from our youngest confirmed to our oldest. Budget Update: The weekly budgeted giving income for 2010 is \$26,923.08 per week. As of June 27, 2010, the budgeted giving income should be \$700,000.00. The actual weekly giving income received to date, June 30, is \$669,592.39, which includes \$49,000 of additional donations toward our six month goal. Please note that we are running in a deficit of \$30,408.

Staff Notes

Andrew Roughgarden has been designated by Session as Ministry Assistant to the Pastor. This is a 10 hours per month volunteer position which will give him an official role at West Side during the time he is looking for a full-time call within the PCUSA. Andy will invest in ministry as directed by the Pastor in the following areas: worship leadership, special projects, teaching, small group leadership, pastoral care, and preaching.

Staff Schedule: Kent Smith has just returned from Henlopen, finished packing up his office, and is headed off for vacation, then retirement. Joanne Rodland is away on vacation until late July—she will be back in the office July 27th. Deborah Holden-Holloway is taking some vacation time this month as well.

Rev. Marc Oehler will worship with us for the first time as our new Associate Pastor on Sunday, July 18th.

July Town Meetings: Dr. Icenogle will lead two town meetings in July, on the 11th and the 25th, each after the 10:00 a.m. service, to discuss the current financial status of West Side, as well as the development of the Strategic Ministry, Mission, Mortar and Money (4M) Plan, and what we intend to do about the pastoral search for the Associate Pastor for Families, Youth and Children. On these two Sundays, Summer VBS will be extended and there will be child care available for pre-school children during the meetings.

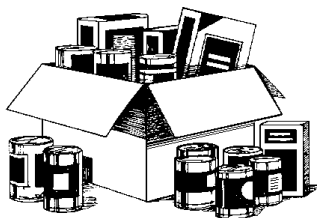
VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

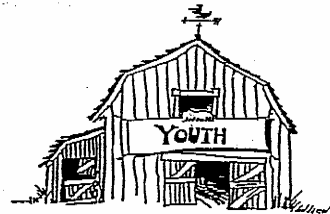

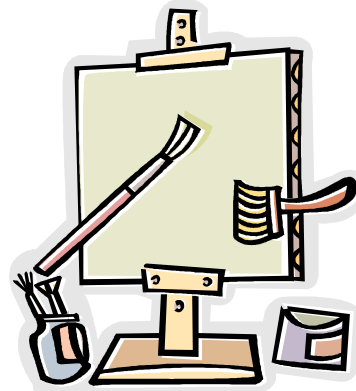

Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) members will be elected by the congregation to search for a new associate pastor for Family, Children and Youth Ministry. They will hopefully be elected in the early Fall.

TRADITIONS AND PRACTICES IN OUR WORSHIP

- Boldface type signifies congregational participation.
- First and final stanzas of hymns are usually sung in unison, middle stanzas in parts.
- Share your prayer concerns on the cards provided in the pew rack. Ushers will collect the cards during the announcements.
- Those arriving after the Call to Worship begins will be seated during the next hymn or the passing of the peace. If you must leave the sanctuary during worship, please wait in the Narthex until the next hymn, the passing of the peace or the doxology before returning to your seat.

OTHER HELPFUL INFORMATION FOR WORSHIPPERS

- Large print bulletins and hymnals are available in the narthex.
- Assistive listening devices are available by contacting one of the ushers.
- Throughout the Sanctuary, there are a number of spaces available for wheelchairs. An usher will be happy to direct you.
