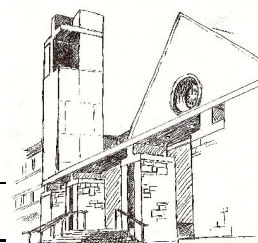

- There will be additional shifting and moving which we will communicate when finalized.



Andrew Roughgarden has been designated by Session as Ministry Assistant to the Pastor. This is a 10 hours per month volunteer position which will give him an official role at West Side during the time he is looking for a full-time call within the PCUSA. Andy will invest in ministry as directed by the Pastor in the following areas: worship leadership, special projects, teaching, small group leadership, pastoral care, and preaching.

Town Meeting Next Sunday: Dr. Icenogle will lead a second town meeting **next Sunday** after the 10:00 a.m. service, to discuss the current financial status of West Side, as well as the development of the Strategic Ministry, Mission, Mortar and Money (4M) Plan, and what we intend to do about the pastoral search for the Associate Pastor for Families, Youth and Children. Summer VBS will be extended and there will be child care available for pre-school children during the meeting.

Notecard Fundraiser - Special Today!! Notecards are available today with no minimum number to purchase. All cards are \$2.00 each ... just make your selection from the available stock. Next week we will introduce some special ideas for Christmas cards! Yes, *Christmas in July!* We will be taking orders for a Special Edition selection that will be on display. John Ianacone has created some new designs. All proceeds benefit West Side.

Budget Update: The weekly budgeted giving income for 2010 is \$26,923.08 per week. As of July 11, 2010, the budgeted giving income should be \$753,846. The actual weekly giving income received to date, July 11, is \$706,998. Please note that we are running in a deficit of \$46,848. Thank you for your generosity to this ministry of Jesus Christ through West Side.

Budget Impact-- Because we are running a \$30,000+ deficit at the half-way point in the year, Session has directed additional cost cutting.

- **Newsletter** production has been suspended for the remainder of 2010.
- **Coffee:** After today, there will be no coffee provided on Sunday mornings or in the office during the week for the remainder of the summer.
- **Statements** will not be sent out this quarter to save money.



Communication: In the absence of the newsletter, there will be increased use of the Sunday bulletin, email and the website. All announcements and information will be in the Sunday bulletin, a copy of which is posted on the website before the weekend for those who won't be able to worship on Sunday. We will also continue the weekly email "This Weekend at West Side" to all members. Those who do not have internet access should contact the church office to get on a bulletin mailing list once per month.

Do We Have Your Email Address?: Sending information by email is by far the most efficient (and free!) way for us to get information into the hands of members. If you have not previously notified the church office of your email address please send an email to Carol Walton (carol@westside.org) or Lisa Stitt (lisa@westside.org). (If you do not receive "This Weekend at West Side," then we do not have your email address.)

Per Capita: Please consider paying your \$28 annual Per Capita fee for being a member of West Side congregation in the Presbyterian Church USA. It is a requirement for being part of the PCUSA. This fee supports the ministry of our presbytery, synod and General Assembly. We pay the fee on every active member. West Side currently has about 1485 active members. At \$28 x 1485, this year West Side will pay an annual fee of about \$41,600 to the greater church. We must pay this fee for every member, from our youngest confirmed to our oldest. If you have children who are members, please remember to encourage them to pay this fee or pay it for them. Thanks for considering this. —Pastor Icenogle

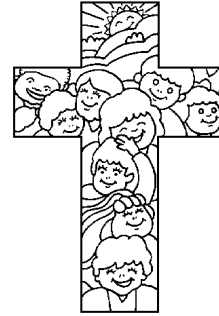

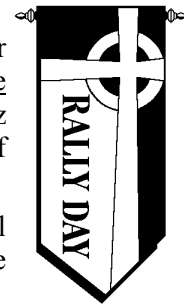
CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES & FAMILY LIFE

Elders function as the primary ruling body of the church.

Deacons shepherd a parish area, perform church service functions on a rotating basis and perform ministering functions.

Trustees have charge of all property of the church, real and personal.

Nominating Committee members receive recommendations for officers from the congregation, prayerfully and carefully considering each. They then bring their nominations to the congregation for election.

Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) is elected by the congregation to search for a new associate pastor for Family, Children and Youth Ministry. The plan is to elect this team in the early Fall.

- Boldface type signifies congregational participation.
- First and final stanzas of hymns are usually sung in unison, middle stanzas in parts.
- Share your prayer concerns on the cards provided in the pew rack. Ushers will collect the cards during the announcements.
- Those arriving after the Call to Worship begins will be seated during the next hymn or the passing of the peace. If you must leave the sanctuary during worship, please wait in the Narthex until the next hymn, the passing of the peace or the doxology before returning to your seat.

- Large print bulletins and hymnals are available in the narthex.
- Assistive listening devices are available by contacting one of the ushers.
- Throughout the Sanctuary, there are a number of spaces available for wheelchairs. An usher will be happy to direct you.
